Quest Village receives partner grant from Dr. Phillips Charities

Orlando, Florida (April 3, 2018) – Quest, Inc., a not-for-profit organization serving individuals with developmental disabilities throughout Central Florida, received a \$250,000 grant from Dr. Phillips Charities in support of Quest Village, a new, innovative residential community for independent adults with developmental disabilities.

The Dr. Phillips name has been a major economic and philanthropic presence in the Central Florida community since the turn of the 20th century. Dr. Phillips Charities honors the legacy of the Phillips family and its support of the organizations that live up to the motto "to help others help themselves."

This partnership grant supports programming at Quest Village and ensures that all residents have the tools they need to succeed.

The community is located off of Woodbury Road, at 12799 Robin Cherney Way, named in memory of an individual served at Quest Training Center in Orlando. Quest Village contains 48 residences, a community center, basketball court and gazebo. Each single-story building offers a modern apartment design with wood-tone floors throughout, one bedroom, one bathroom, a dine-in kitchen, a living room, a washer and dryer, a covered porch, extra storage space and Wi-Fi capabilities.

"Quest Village fills a gap for people with developmental disabilities who are ready to live independently," said Brooke Eakins, Chief Operating Officer, Quest, Inc. "The community allows residents to thrive with unparalleled access to employment, entertainment, education, and other community activities while gaining friendships and living in a positive environment with neighbors who share similar interests."
